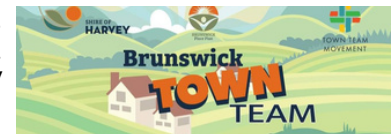
All in all, a glorious day and the enthusiasm shared by those attending, helped to make the combination of events a success, one that may well be scheduled again in the future.

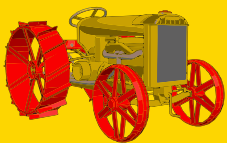

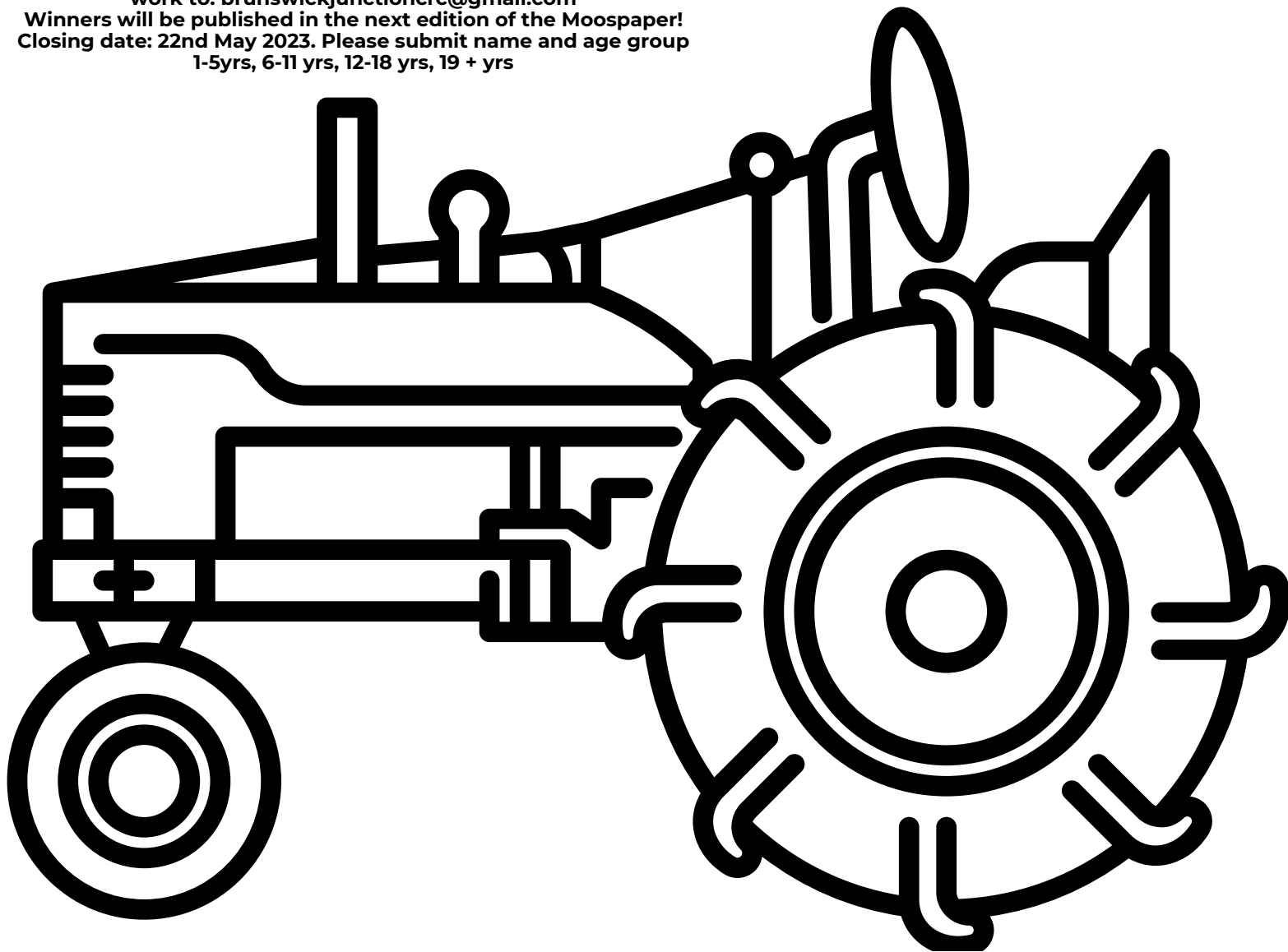

We will report back the results in the next edition of The Moospaper and discuss at our May meeting on Saturday, 20th May in the community garden. If in the meantime, you have a tried and tested method, we would love to hear more or if you'd like to compare findings, then please join us in the garden.

For further garden design approaches, check out the free course, detailed below:

Garden Pest Management

Out with the dry and in with the wet. It is now open season for the cool season pests. We have now definitely closed the doors on the warm, dry season and are ready preparing for the cooler and wetter months. In the Community Garden, this means sowing winter vegetables and keeping an eye on potential pests, especially snail activity! Often asked what the best deterrents are, we have decided to conduct some trials. Over the next few weeks, we are setting up some cunning traps with environmentally friendly methods:

Beer trap – sinking a dish into the veggie beds to soil level, filling with beer for the snails to drink

Vegemite trap – a yeast alternative to the above

Sugar/honey trap – for the sweet-toothed molluscs

Copper Wire – attached to the top of the veggie bed

Salt barrier – used around pots to avoid contaminating the soil (Alternatively use Coffee grounds)

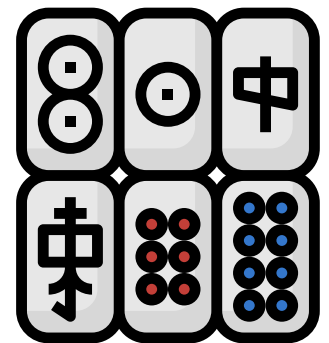

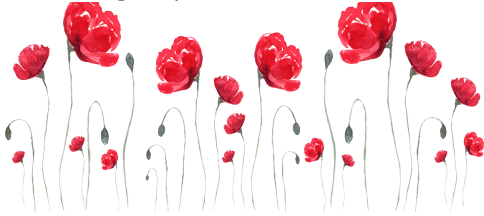
Brunswick Junction ANZAC Day Service 25 Apr 23

This year, I officiated for the Shire of Harvey at Brunswick Junction for their ANZAC Day Service.

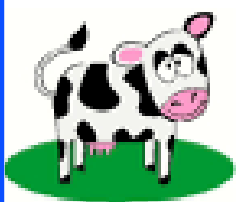
