

Hellooooooooooo Brunswick! Thanks for joining us for what has, in the past, been the bumper Brunswick Show issue of The Moospaper. The continuing Coronavirus pandemic has seen the cancellation of many events, including Brunswick Show which was planned for October 24th, as organisers seek to keep everyone safe in these uncertain times. Volunteers at Brunswick Agricultural Society will use this year's preparations as a plan for next year's show and look forward to welcoming everyone back to the Brunswick Show in 2021.

The Government's Phase 5 restrictions plan is set to come into effect on October 24th, resulting in the lifting of the 2 square metre rule and the removal of the 50 per cent capacity limit for large venues, including major sporting and entertainment venues.

The cancellation of Brunswick Show has been disappointing after the dedicated work of the Agricultural Society volunteers, as many businesses and community groups will miss out on the economic benefits generated by the Show. However, the general local feeling is that the Agricultural Society has made the right decision, albeit difficult, in the interests of public safety. It seems no country shows will be held this year, with the Waroona and Collie Shows also cancelled in the wake of the cancellation of Perth Royal Show. Despite restrictions and cancellations, there seems to be a sense of gratitude and contentment amongst the people of Brunswick and surrounds, while they remain quietly alert and follow recommendations to try and keep our community safe. The Moospaper hears ongoing stories of locals helping locals, trading produce, helping with groceries and generally supporting each other. Some even decided to find a fun way to boost local morale, raise awareness and remind people of safety practices such as hygiene and distancing... which is how a mask ended up on the Brunswick Cow! 



FESTA MASS CELEBRATION

Brunswick Catholic community found a different way to continue since 1956 a tradition in the unusual times of 2020.

The "Festa" has been held in Brunswick for over 50 vears, with Mass held in the Town Hall to accommodate the busloads of visitors who join locals for this tradition. The day includes a procession around the oval and benediction, and Brunswick has welcomed up to 300 people to the event in previous years, including visiting priests. With pandemic restrictions limiting the number of people at gatherings, and distancing requirements unable to be met for such a large group, the local parish was told that there would be no Festa this year. However, parishioners were able to celebrate on a much smaller scale, with Mass held at Brunswick Catholic church. While there was no benediction or procession, and very few visitors made the journey to Brunswick, the congregation was pleased to be part of a special Sunday Mass in honour of Our Lady of The Assumption, after Whom the parish is named. This was followed by a small gathering of locals in the parish centre, who enjoyed a light lunch and some fellowship to mark the Feast Madaffari. Day which falls on 15 August.

The practice of the annual Festa was brought to Brunswick many years ago by immigrants from the Father Jess town of Delianuova in Italy and has been held annually except for a couple of years during World War II. The community looks forward to welcoming the tradition back to town in 2021.



RIVER COTTAGES

You may have noticed that the Brunswick River Cottages (BRC) Stage 2 is now complete, with all rental units fully occupied, Lease for Life unit 18 purchased by a local family and number 17 and 19 currently on the market.

Planning of the next stage has started to take shape with the Shire of Harvey staff dedicating many hours into the Business Case for further funding. This also includes the wonderful advocacy and support from parliamentary members Robyn Clarke MLA, Colin Holt MLC and Liza Harvey MLA.

The Business Case includes a further 12 rental units, which are very much needed with a waitlist of almost 20 eligible older Australians and the communal area which will be a place of kin-ship for Brunswick River Cottages residents and their families to enjoy.

Did you know that Brunswick River Cottages is a volunteer board partnered with the Shire of Harvey to manage a local housing project? The committee is dedicated to managing the growth and economic benefits that the Brunswick River Cottages complex will bring to Brunswick.

Being a community housing managed project means that management can ensure residents are a good fit for Brunswick, management wants to see residents who will participate in the active lifestyle Brunswick has to offer. We congratulate a number of our current residents who volunteer with several local community groups; Hands up for Kids, Brunswick Red Cross, Brunswick Men's Shed, Brunswick Lions, Brunswick Community Resource Centre and the Brunswick Community Garden.
