## MOVIES & MEMORIES

With just under a week to make the final preparations for a Seniors' Week Event, Brunswick CRC and the Shire of Harvey's community development office, pulled together plans to host a special event!

A morning of 'Movies and Memories' was arranged around a recording of video footage filmed in the Brunswick District. As a centrepiece of the event, it provided the focus for a trip down memory lane, revealing early agricultural practices in the area, as well as featuring clips of Brunswick Shows from yesteryear.

The recording consisted of three parts; the first made by a travelling filmmaker in the mid 1950's showing agricultural developments in the area. This included demonstrations of channel irrigation methods, paddock preparation and the growing and harvesting of potatoes - including loading onto trains for transportation and delivery to Bunbury Jetty. The audience were reminded of how, in the absence of modern-day machinery, farming practices were reliant on manual labour, demanding peak levels of fitness and strong backs - chiropractors nor soothing muscle rubs were available 'off the shelf' as they are today!

Footage of Brunswick Shows from 1953, 1955 and then again in 1979 and 1981 followed, revealing activities recognisable in more recent times - the show appeared to be as popular then, as it is now. Some of the key noticeable differences though, were the changes in fashion over the decades and the introduction of health and safety regulations!

All in all, the event was enjoyed by the audience, especially for a few members present who could recognise themselves featured on the screen!

The Shire of Harvey delivered with a delicious morning tea at the half-way interval, providing a further opportunity to share more golden memories of yesteryear.

# REMEMBRANCE DAY HONOURS BRUNSWICK VETERAN

A warm and breezy spring morning saw the community come together at the Harvey War Memorial to commemorate Remembrance Day and reflect on the sacrifices that countless people have made in service to their country. Remembrance Day 2023 marks the 105th anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I in 1918.

Organised by the RSL Harvey, the service included a welcome address by Mr Eric Hall, President of the RSL Harvey Sub Branch, wreath laying, the Last Post and One Minute Sacred Silence.

RSL members, veterans, their families and the general public gathered together to reflect on the incredible bravery and sacrifice of those who served, with the highlight of the morning the presentation of medallions and certificates to Vietnam War Veterans.

To acknowledge the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War, a Commemorative Medallion and Certificate of Commemoration have been made available to every Australian veteran, or their widow or other family member, who served in the Vietnam War.

Brunswick's Mr Trevor Roberts was one of nine Vietnam veterans to be recognised, with presentations made to all veterans by Forrest Member Nola Marino MP.

Trevor uses these days of remembrance to reminisce about his fellow soldiers, some of whom didn't return home. He continues to attend reunions held by his company around Australia, held every two years. The days are also important for members of Trevor's family, who as well as being very proud of him, are extremely grateful that he came home and is with them today.

"The catch ups are even more important as we all get older," said Trevor.

Congratulations to Trevor and "thank you" from all at the Moospaper and the community of Brunswick.

# 'HOME INSTEAD' - INFORMATION SESSION FOR IN-HOME CARE

Natalie Moorhouse from 'Home Instead Bunbury' recently visited our CRC on Thursday 16th November to explain the intricacies of navigating Aged Care. 'Home Instead' is a national provider of high-quality, relationship-based, in-home care for ageing Australians and their mission is to help with a range of personal and lifestyle needs while providing welcome companionship. Natalie described the resources available to help with understanding the aged care system, negotiating family relationships and difficult conversations resources on home safety, end-of-life planning and managing conditions such as dementia. She emphasised how all of 'Home Instead's' care services are available immediately - even if clients are waiting for an ACAT or ACAS assessment, or in the national prioritisation queue.

There are no minimum age requirements or residency restrictions, the Home Care Packages Programme has been developed to assist frailer older Australians to remain in their homes. To find out if you are eligible for a Home Care Package, contact My Aged Care, who will refer you to an Aged Care Assessment Team (ACAT)\* for an in-person assessment. They will determine your eligibility, and which Home Care level best suits your needs.

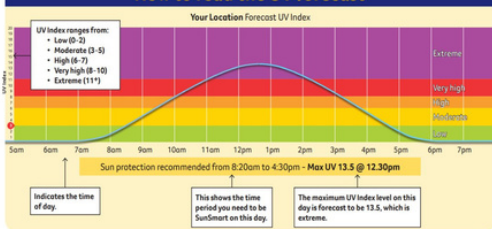
## How to be SunSmart

Often called our 'national cancer', Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer of the world. Two in three Australians will develop skin cancer in their lifetime, and every year around 2,000 Aussies will die from this disease. The good news is that skin cancer is largely preventable by minimising exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun. Being SunSmart is a simple and effective way to reduce your risk of developing skin cancer. For your local UV forecast go to: <https://www.myuv.com.au/?location>

There's more to sun protection than sunscreen. Protect yourself in five ways:

- Slip** on sun protective clothing
- Slop** on SPF 30 (or higher) sunscreen
- Slop** on a broad-brimmed hat
- Seek** shade
- Slide** on wrap-around sunglasses

### How to read the UV forecast



### Find Skin Cancer Early

Common skin cancer symptoms:

- A new spot or mole on your skin that is red, pale or pearly in colour
- A spot that is different from other spots on your skin
- Any crusty or non-healing sores
- Any spots, freckles or any moles changing in size (width), thickness (height), colour, or shape

Get to know your skin and what's normal for you, particularly if you're over 40 years of age. If you notice any of these symptoms or any other unusual changes, tell your doctor without delay.

If it's skin cancer, the earlier it's found, the greater the chance of successful treatment.

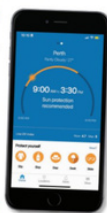

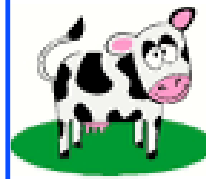
