The call went out in early February from the Agricultural Brunswick Society President Julianne Hill, the theme for this year's show would be `Rural Emergency Services'.....with this call reaching all 8 services. Roll forward to October 2022 and we are all ready to showcase the people, services and operational capabilities that keep our communities safe in times of need.

When visiting the Show Day this year ensure you make your way to the football oval arena, Bush Fire Readiness display, Display on the new show; Agencies on site are:

- St John Ambulance
- Bush Fire Service
- Western Australia Police
- Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service
- State Emergency Service
- Volunteer Marine Search and Rescue
- RAC Helicopter
- Royal Flying Doctor Service

Each of the Emergency Services will be providing demonstrations on vehicle operation, call-out procedures, community safety and operational procedures. Keep an eye on the Show day program for confirmed times for the featured displays by the BFS, SJA and VFRS. Kids and adults alike can enjoy the following demonstrations and activities:

Another exciting year awaits us in the Quality Trade Cattle section at the 2022 Brunswick Show.

We have changed the schedule a few times over the past 7 years. We found it extremely important to stay relevant to the industry and its requirements. This included tweaks with grid specifications mainly with respect to weights but the biggest change has been with the calf classes.

We previously had milk calves off their mums and mostly sold directly to butcher shops. This demand has severely decreased as has our commitment to best welfare practices by not having unweaned animals in the public domain. This in turn has increased the support from graziers and feed lotters.

We currently have close to \$16000 in prizes as well as thousands of dollars worth of free transport from Mitchell's Livestock for all successful purchasers.

Floral Art, is a floral design in an art form where the medium is the plant material. Artistic design is a statement of individual creativity using the elements and principles of design. The designer strives to attain the qualities of beauty, simplicity, expression and harmony in all designs.


Some designs are definitions with direction and rules that outline the creation, others are Interpretative where the designer translates a message of the subject title.



Auctioned for \$5,000 grandfather-grandson duo Mario and James Giacci of MGM Bulk placed the winning bid on Clarabelle the cow on Show day.

James Giacci, marketing manager of the familyowned business, said that moment was the genesis of the Cow for Cancer project.

"We had one of our pink 60-metre ultra-quad road trains on display there. We were working closely with Solaris [Cancer Care centres] on the day to try to raise some money for them," he said.

"They were auctioning off this life-size fibreglass cow and we were the highest bidder on the day. That essentially meant that we got to keep that cow for the next 12 months and we could do anything with it." he said.

Having just completed a 4,000-kilometre journey around Western Australia, Clarabelle has raised over \$118,000 for cancer care.

"It [the idea] was to take this cow on a 4000-kilometre road trip around Western Australia working with Solaris Cancer Care along the way, trying to raise some money and obviously highlight the support that they offer people who are going through cancer treatment," Mr Giacci said.

Clarabelle will be returned to the show grounds ahead of the show where she will be auctioned off again to raise money for the Royal Flying Doctors service.
