It's showtime! All roads will lead to Brunswick on Saturday 25 October for the 94th annual Brunswick Show! The theme Arts and Culture will be showcased throughout the show, along with the usual hall exhibits, animals, stalls, food, games, sideshow alley and fireworks! It's a big weekend in town, with the horse events Gymkhana on Sunday 26 October!

In the lead-up to the Show, the month of October is busy, beginning with a special event on Saturday 4th October. The Roelands Hall Centenary Celebration marks 100 years of the community hall, which has been consistently used since being built in 1925. Past and present residents of Roelands, along with the general public, are invited to gather and share stories about Roelands and its people. Organisers are hoping to capture stories, photos and contacts to expand upon the towns known history. BRUNSWICK SHOW TO SHOWCASE ARTS AND CULTURE IN 2025

A CELEBRATION OF COMMUNITY, CREATIVITY, AND TRADITION

The Brunswick Show will return on Saturday, October 25, bringing the community together for a day that promises colour, creativity, and country spirit. This year's theme, "Showcasing Arts and Culture", reflects the vibrant blend of rural tradition and artistic expression that defines the South West.

Located in the heart of one of Western Australia's strongest farming districts, the Brunswick Show has become one of the state's largest one-day agricultural events. While livestock competitions and machinery displays remain at its core, the Show continues to grow into something much bigger — a showcase of our community, weaving together tradition, culture, and creativity.

Brunswick Agricultural Society President David Power said this year's theme was about honouring both the region's history and its creativity.

Visitors can expect a program bursting with variety, featuring everything from cattle judging competitions, agricultural displays and demonstrations, and the thrilling Battle of the Butchers, to motocross shows, working sheep dogs, and bucking bulls. Families will enjoy the Lions Animal Nursery, sideshow alley, food vans, free family entertainment, and the ever-popular Beverage Barn and Meating Marquee. The arts and cultural displays and cultural dances will highlight the region's heritage, while exhibitors and traders showcase local talent and produce.

The evening program is set to deliver something never before seen at the Show. At 7:30pm, a fleet of 150 drones will rise above the Showgrounds in the Alcoa/Lotterywest Drone Show, telling stories of the region's farming history, Italian influence, and the legacy of Brownes Dairy. The display will even feature a cow in the sky, a playful nod to the district's dairy heritage.

With a full day of entertainment, displays, and competitions capped off by a dazzling night show, the 2025 Brunswick Agricultural Show is set to be one of the most exciting yet. From the first ribbon awarded in the cattle yards to the final firework lighting up the sky, it promises something for everyone. Mark your calendars for Saturday, October 25, and join the community in celebrating the tradition, creativity, and culture that make the Brunswick Show a highlight of the South West.



BRUNSWICK SHOW TO LIGHT UP THE NIGHT SKY

This year's Brunswick Agricultural Show promises to end with a spectacular twist, as the skies above the Showgrounds come alive with a dazzling combination of drones and fireworks.

For the first time outside of Perth, Alcoa has partnered with the Brunswick Agricultural Society to help bring a large-scale drone display to a regional community event. Alcoa's Wagerup community relations manager, Tom Busher, said the idea was embraced straight away. "When David bounced the idea off us, we just loved it — bringing something different to a regional community," he said. "The way the show seems to want to go, I expect there will be a lot of people attending, and they are going to find a real 'wow' factor."

The show will open with a Welcome to Country, acknowledging the Traditional Owners of the land, before turning to stories of the Brunswick region's proud farming and cultural heritage. A fleet of 150 drones will take to the sky, creating images that reflect the area's traditions, from farming scenes to a tribute to Brownes Dairy and the strong Italian influence that has shaped the town. "There will even be a cow in the sky," Brunswick Agricultural Society president David Power said.

The theme of this year's Show is showcasing arts and culture, and the drone display has been made possible thanks to the support of Alcoa, Lotterywest, and Southern Ports. Mr Power said the dream of hosting a drone show had been years in the making. "We just want to pay respect to the history of the local area," he said.

The drone show will be followed by a South32 fireworks display, ensuring the evening finishes with a bang. While the light show will be a major highlight, organisers are quick to point out there is plenty more to enjoy across the day — from agricultural machinery and animal displays to wool spinners, live music, sideshow alley, and the grand parade.

The Brunswick Show takes place on Saturday, October 25, with the night spectacular beginning at 7:30pm at the Brunswick Showgrounds. "As long as the weather's good, everyone will have a great day," Mr Power said.

QUALITY TRADE CATTLE

The Brunswick Show has long been a showcase of the region's agricultural heart, and the Quality Trade Cattle section is one of its most celebrated features. Each year, local graziers, industry supporters, and families gather to see some of the finest livestock on display and to share in the traditions that make the event unique.

Show day begins early for a dedicated team of volunteers who draft, weigh, and prepare cattle for the judging ring. Their hard work sets the stage for the presentation of prizes and ribbons at 10:00am, where the best of the best are recognised.

At 10:20am, the spotlight shifts to the auction ring. A professional auctioneer takes to the stand, giving the crowd a front-row seat to the energy of a live cattle sale. It is a chance for the public to experience the real business of the beef industry as livestock are sold.

The journey doesn't end when the gavel falls. Mitchell's Livestock Transport once again donates its trucks, staff, and time to deliver cattle to their new homes across the state. Their efforts, entirely voluntary, ensure the section runs smoothly from start to finish.

The committee encourages showgoers to keep an eye out for Mitchell's big red trucks as they roll into the Showgrounds in the afternoon. "Give them a wave," a spokesperson said. "They're part of the team of volunteers who make this day possible."







BRUNSWICK SHOW TO HOST STUD SHEEP CENTENARY CELEBRATION

The Brunswick Show will have extra reason to celebrate this year, with the Australian Stud Sheep Breeders Association (ASSBA) marking its 100th year.

The Stud Sheep section, always a popular drawcard, will showcase some of the regions finest long wool breeds, including Border Leicester, English Leicester, Lincoln, Romney, and Cheviot. Entries are open to all registered ASSBA members, with prizes of \$20 for first place, \$10 for second, and \$5 for third across a range of classes.



Competitors will present rams and ewes born in 2024, older stock, production ewes with lambs, and breeding pairs. From these classes, awards will be given for Champion Ram, Champion Ewe, and Best of Breed, sponsored by ASSBA's WA Branch.

Chief Steward Peter Gelmi said the section would be a highlight of the Show, with early penning available from Friday, October 24. All sheep must be penned by 8:00am on Show day, with inspections beginning shortly after and judging starting at 9:00am.

With a century of stud sheep breeding behind it, ASSBA's celebration at Brunswick is set to recognise the tradition, skill, and dedication that continue to shape Australia's sheep industry.

BRUNSWICK SHOW SUPPORTS HEALTHY AGEING RESEARCH

The Brunswick Agricultural Show has announced its chosen charity for 2025, supporting groundbreaking research into Healthy Ageing conducted by the Health Futures Institute at Murdoch University.

The initiative, led by the Centre for Healthy Ageing, explores why some Australians aged 80 and above are able to maintain strong cognitive health despite common risk factors for dementia and Alzheimer's disease. The project, titled "Investigating resilience to age-related decline in cognition and function in Australia's oldest old: The 80+ Study", is spearheaded by Lead Investigator Professor Hamid Sohrabi. Researchers hope to uncover the biological, psychological, and lifestyle factors that protect against decline, paving the way for future prevention strategies and improved quality of life for older adults.

Brunswick Agricultural Society President David Power said the cause was one that would resonate across the community. "Almost every family has been touched in some way by dementia or age-related decline. By supporting this research, the Brunswick Show is helping to shine a light on work that could change the future for older Australians," he said.

By partnering with Murdoch University's research, the Brunswick Show is ensuring that the day's celebrations also contribute to a brighter, healthier future for generations to come.

The crowd-favourite R.M. Williams Agriculture Challenge will once again take centre stage at the Brunswick Show on Saturday, October 25, 2025, bringing with it plenty of laughs, competition, and community spirit.

First introduced at the 2019 Show, the event was so well-received that it has become a permanent fixture in the program. This year's challenge will begin at 10:30am in the Main Arena, with teams of three racing against the clock to complete a series of hands-on agricultural tasks. Some of the items on display got a very, very close inspection .




