Welcome to a new monthly garden feature, bringing horticultural updates, tips and news for all community members.

The Community Garden in Brunswick is one of many projects run by Brunswick Community Resource Centre. The atmosphere is casual and friendly with members who hail from many parts of the Harvey Shire and new faces are always welcome.

Pictured, are some of our wicking beds which have produced abundant crops of seasonal vegetables over the years. Unfortunately, this summer's devastating heat waves have 'challenged' many of our plants. Overall, the original installation of the wicking beds in 2016 has allowed, for example, tomato crops to thrive throughout the summer. However,

as a result of the recent extreme weather conditions, the garden club has decided to explore growing a range of succulents.

The 'Succulents for Sale' initiative aims to raise funds for replenishing the soil in the garden beds. The 'team' is already potting up and invite local green thumbs to bring their excess succulent offcuts and emerging 'pups'.

Rather than adding unwanted cuttings to your green waste bin, we would like to invite you to the community garden for a visit, with your trimmings. Open Tuesday – Friday 9am to 3pm, the garden is located behind the CRC, next to the main entrance of the Brunswick Showgrounds. Members and friends of the community garden meet every THIRD Saturday of the month for a social garden experience with like-minded garden enthusiasts. Speaking of the community, there are a couple of new faces at Brunswick Post Office!








Sr Eileen was known as Sister Rosarii and when a group of Presentation Sisters resided in Brunswick.

May she Rest In Peace.











Social Ladies Night .



LEESA SUTHERLAND <u>Mrs Galati – A Smile for All and a Heart of</u> Gold

Giovannina Galati-Rando, affectionatelv known to

Brunswick locals as Mrs Galati or Mrs G, and to her loving family as mum was and always will be a name that goes hand in hand with the fondly remembered Galati's Deli in Brunswick.



For all your fresh fruit and vegetables,

small goods, groceries, confectionery and cigarettes, A. & G. Galati & Co was the place to go. Located at 39 Ommaney Road in Brunswick Junction, with telephone number 261235, everyone has their memories of this beautiful family business that for 27 years, provided a cherished service to the community of Brunswick.


In partnership with her husband Antonino Galati and daughter Nina, Galati's Deli came to be. After leaving school at the end of Year 10, Nina worked a job in the deli in Brunswick Junction and a few years later, with the support and encouragement of her mum, bought the shop and the family of nine moved to Brunswick Junction from Benger. This is where the story of Galati's Deli - Take Aways begins. Mrs Galati began learning the ins and outs of how a deli operated, a small hurdle being she wasn't able to read or write in English. Any small piece of paper was used to add up how much a customer needed to pay, as well as working out their change – no calculator or till required.

In the first years after purchasing the shop, Mrs Galati worked seven days a week, from 6.00 am in the morning until 10.00 pm at night. The deli sold a comprehensive range of continental lines, grocery items, fresh fruit and vegetables, and takeaway food, all with the option to book goods up and pay later. All daily newspapers were available, as well as weekly magazines.

A Sunday Times delivery round was another service offered, with the eldest of the Galati children delivering the newspapers on Sunday mornings. Mrs Galati would wait up every Saturday night until the papers were delivered and then bring the bundled-up newspapers inside. Early Sunday morning she would roll the papers, tie them with string and have them ready to be delivered before anyone else was out of bed. For those of us who grew up in Brunswick, it would be remiss not to mention the mixed lollies on offer at the shop. Two lollies for one cent! I personally recall the beautifully packaged Easter egg gift boxes that could be purchased from the shop at Easter time.

In 1996 Antonino and Giovannina sold the shop, retired and moved into their dream home on George Avenue in Brunswick.

Be it your memories of arcade games Bubble Bobble or Double Dragon, collecting scripts brought from Harvey, Slush Puppie's, or meeting up with friends, the days of Galati's Deli will forever be a part of Brunswick's treasured history
